## January 15 at The Phoenix Club a Great Success

Want to be among the best dressed attending Starlighter dances? Follow these simple fashion rules so you will always be "in style" and avoid a fashion faux pas.

**Formals:** Men should wear an evening tuxedo or a formal dark or black suit. Women should dress in an evening gown or a formal evening pants suit.

**Semi—Formals:** Men should wear a business suit or a sport coat and tie. Women should wear a cocktail dress or a dressy pants suit.

Winter-Summer Casuals: "Dressy Casual": Men should wear slacks and collared shirts. Women should wear a casual pant suit, dress or skirt. <u>Shorts</u> on men or women are not appropriate at any dance.

Theme Dances—use your creativity and have some fun with the theme.

Our Phoenix Club dance, January 16, was just great fun. Thirty eight couples attended, including two guest couples, a good turnout. Jon Destry was great as usual, playing some great music and doing a new "show", adding to the dance fun for the evening. "Satisfaction Survey Sheet" responses showed that nearly everyone evaluated the evening as first rate and a very good time. Almost all rated the room/dinner/band good to excellent except four "fairs" for the dinner, and four "fairs" for the band. That said, the actual compilation of numbers showed that 100% rated the room as good to excellent. 91% rated the dinner as good

to excellent. 88% rated the band as good to excellent. Your Board plans to give feedback to the Phoenix Club (and all our venues) to let them know areas where they can improve for our next dance.

Results of the survey of dances showed that the fox trot and the waltz were about tied for most popular, followed by EC & WC swing, then followed by the chacha. Trailing were the rumba and tango. <u>Your responses on the</u> <u>Survey Sheets are very important!!</u>
