**Did You Know?** The city of Anaheim was founded in 1857 by grape farmers and wine makers from Franconia in Bavaria. The first such settler was Daniel Kraemer. The colony was situated on 1,165 acres (4.71 km<sup>2</sup>).

Settlers voted to call the community Annaheim, meaning Annahome or more longly "Home in the valley" in German. The name later was changed slightly, to Anaheim. To the Spanish-speaking neighbors, the settlement was known as Campo Alemán (Spanish for German Camp).

**THE BOSA NOVA BEGAN IN THE 1960's**

In Brazil, to do something with "bossa" is to do it with particular charm and natural flair, as in an innate ability. In 1932, Noel Rosa used the word in a samba, which went "O samba, a prontidão e outras bossas / São nossas coisas, são coisas nossas" ("The samba, the readiness and other bossas / Are our things, are things from us").

As yet, the exact origin of the term "bossa nova" remains uncertain.

What is certain is that the term "bossa" was used to refer to any new "trend" or "fashionable wave" within the artistic beach-culture of late 1950's Rio de Janeiro.

The term finally became known and widely used to refer to a new music style, a fusion of samba and jazz, when the now famous creators of "bossa nova", referred to their new style of work as "a bossa nova," as in "the new thing."

**SPRING CLEANING AND MEN**

**SPOTLIGHT ON A TOPPER**

*Martha And Ace Yeam*

Like so many others have done, Ace and Martha found one another after the death of their respective spouses. Ace and his first wife Janet were members of Toppers from 1985 to her passing away after 49 years of marriage.

Martha's first husband died shortly after celebrating their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

Some years later, friends invited Martha to the Petroleum Club for Monday Night Football. She had no idea that she would meet Ace that night and that they would have so much in common such as a love of music, singing and dancing to big band music. They dated for a year and married at the Petroleum Club in November 2000.

Ace has a son, daughter and three grand-daughters. Martha has a daughter, step-daughter, grand-daughter and two step-grandsons. All the children live fairly close except Martha's daughter who lives in North Carolina.

Ace was born in Souris, North Dakota and moved to Long Beach when he was 15 years old. He graduated from Long Beach Polytechnic High School. The day before he turned 18, he joined the Marine Corps in Jan. of 1945. Fresh out of 'boot camp' Camp Pendleton training, he was sent to Okinawa, Japan where the last major battle in the Pacific theatre

(WW2) was being fought and eventually won in June of 1945. The island was eventually returned to Japan in 1972.

Ace had enlisted for 4 years and though WW2 was over, he completed his service in China for 15 months and returned to Camp Pendleton. When he completed his enlistment, Ace wanted to attend college but they were full of returning GIs.

So Ace decided to re-enlist and make the Marine Corps a military career. He then served in Korea and Viet Nam, retiring at the rank of Major in 1967 after serving 22 years.

After retiring from the military, Ace joined Toyota Motor sales, as a National Parts Distribution Manager and retired again after 20 years.

Though retiring from full time work, he continued to work as a consultant for major car companies until he decided to stay home and care for his ill wife Janet.

Martha was born in Louisville, Kentucky.

Martha married at 18 to an ex-Marine who had served in WW2 and he was recalled during the Korean War. They eventually settled in Southern California. Martha was employed in the accounting field and retired in 1990.

Ace and Martha love dancing, traveling, the Toppers and the Petroleum Club. They have made many dear and treasured friends over the years through these associations.
